CIVIL RIGHTS INFORMATION



Medford Public Schools

Civil Rights Legislation

Section 504: of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973

Prohibits discrimination, exclusion from participation, and denial of benefits based on disability.

Title I of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

Prohibits discrimination, exclusion from participation, and denial of benefits on the basis of disability in the areas of employment.

Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

Prohibits discrimination, exclusion from participation, and denial of benefits on the basis of disability in the areas of education programming and activities

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964

Prohibits discrimination in, exclusion from, participation in, and denial of benefits from any program or activity receiving Federal funding on the basis of race, color, or national origin.

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972

Prohibits discrimination, exclusion from participation in, and denial of benefits, on the basis of sex, in educational programs receiving Federal funding.

Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 76, Section 5

Prohibits discrimination in all public schools. No person shall be excluded from or discriminated against in admission to a public school of any town, or in obtaining the advantages, privileges and courses of study of such public school on account of race, color, sex, gender identity, religion, national origin or sexual orientation.
